



REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Benton-Meier Neuropsychology Scholarships

The American Psychological Foundation (APF) provides financial support for innovative research and programs that enhance the power of psychology to elevate the human condition and advance human potential both now and in generations to come.

Amount:

Two \$2,500 scholarships are available for graduate students in Neuropsychology.

Eligibility:

Applicants must be graduate students in psychology enrolled full time and in good standing at accredited universities.

APF encourages proposals from individuals who represent diversity in race, ethnicity, gender, age, disability, and sexual orientation.

Application Materials:

Candidates must show evidence of need and present a record of achievement that would indicate a promising career in the field.

Candidates should submit:

- A statement of outlining how the scholarship money will be used.
- A letter that documents their scholarly and/or research accomplishments. The letter must be co-signed by the candidate's faculty mentor or director of training, after he or she has certified the accuracy of the student's information.
- A budget for the proposed work with an explanation of how the money will be used; and a listing of other funding sources.

Submit a proposal, letter of recommendation from a faculty advisor and CV online at <http://forms.apa.org/apf/grants/> by **June 1, 2010**.
