



### Joseph B. Gittler Award

The American Psychological Foundation (APF) provides financial support for innovative research and programs that enhance the power of psychology to elevate the human condition and advance human potential both now and in generations to come.

The Joseph B. Gittler Award was established through a bequest from Dr. Joseph Gittler, who wished to recognize the most scholarly contribution to the philosophical foundations of psychological knowledge.

**Amount:** \$10,000

**Eligibility:** The Joseph B. Gittler Award goes to a scholar whose body of work or whose individual work is of such consequence to have transformed the field of psychology, as outlined above.

*APF encourages nominations for individuals who represent diversity in race, ethnicity, gender, age, disability, and sexual orientation.*

**Application Process:** Nominations should include:

- A letter of nomination outlining the nominee's contributions to the area.
- A current CV.
