**REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS**  
*APF Henry David Research Grant*

The American Psychological Foundation (APF) provides financial support for innovative research and programs that enhance the power of psychology to elevate the human condition and advance human potential both now and in generations to come.

The American Psychological Foundation's Henry David Fund was established to support young psychologists with a demonstrated interest in the behavioral aspects of human reproductive behavior or an area related to population concerns.

The fund sponsors the *Henry David Research Grant*, which provides up to \$1,500 for support of ongoing research in behavioral aspects of population studies or human reproductive behavior.

**Eligibility:**

Applicants must be graduate students conducting dissertation research or early career researchers with not more than seven (7) years postgraduate experience. All applicants must show a demonstrated interest in human reproductive behavior or related population concerns. Awards are open to applicants in all relevant disciplines who have a demonstrated psychological approach to their work, with preference given to psychologists. *APF encourages applications from individuals who represent diversity in race, ethnicity, gender, age, disability, and sexual orientation.*

**Applications Procedures:**

Submit a completed application online at <http://forms.apa.org/apf/grants/> by **February 15, 2010**.

Applications materials must include:

- A one to two-page detailed research plan, to include the applicant's discipline/area of study, degree status (e.g., graduate student, PhD, EdD, PsyD, other), and the date the degree was or will be obtained;
- Brief statement of how the applicant plans to use the grant money (3-5 sentences);
- Current vita highlighting relevant experience; and
- Two (2) letters of recommendation
