The membership in Division 18 has gradually increased over the past three years, with 1150 members in 2003 and 1239 in 2005, a total increase of 89 members over the past three years. In 2005, 163 new members joined in all categories with about half the same number of members leaving the Division for a variety of reasons. The Community and State Hospital and Criminal Justice sections increased in membership the most, with about a 15% increase in each section.

As the Membership Chair, I bill first-year Members, Affiliates, and Student Affiliates, along with Dues-Exempt Members who receive the newsletter. This year, income from these sources totaled \$8110, which was significantly above the \$4985 funds raise in 2004. In summary, the Division is doing well in both membership and new-member dues income.
