Guidelines for Contributors

Content

Military Psychology is the quarterly journal of the Division of Military Psychology (Division 19) of the American Psychological Association. The journal seeks to facilitate the scientific development of military psychology by encouraging communication between researchers and practitioners.

The domain of military psychology is the conduct of research or practice of psychological principles within a military environment. The journal publishes behavioral science research articles having military applications in the areas of clinical and health psychology, training and human factors, manpower and personnel, social and organizational systems, and testing and measurement. Topics of major concern to military psychology will be covered in special journal issues.

Military Psychology is international in scope, and the editors encourage submission of articles that address research being carried out in a variety of national settings.

Contributions will be considered for publication in the following areas:

- *Research Articles*: Reports of empirical research.
- *Notes*: Brief articles describing work that is largely confirmatory, advances in knowledge arising as by-products of broader studies, or new research techniques and methodologies.

- Reviews: Scholarly integrations of individual areas of empirical research.
- Communications: Information on policies and trends that affect the support and direction of research in military psychology.
- Clinical Practice: Case studies, theoretical articles, program development evaluations, and research articles of direct application for military psychologists in clinical settings.

Comments and *Letters to the Editor* will be published on a space-available basis.

Submission of Manuscript

Cover Letter

The cover letter should request publication of the manuscript in *Military Psychology* and should include (a) a statement that the findings reported in the manuscript have not been previously published and that the manuscript is not being simultaneously submitted elsewhere; (b) confirmation that all original research procedures were consistent with the principles of research ethics published by the American Psychological Association, except as may be detailed in the manuscript; and (c) a request for blind review, if desired.

Manuscript Preparation

Manuscripts should be double-spaced, highly legible, and prepared according to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (4th ed.), which may be obtained from APA, 750 First Street, NE, Washington, DC 20002-4242. Manuscripts will not be returned to authors.

Research manuscripts should be no more than 25 pages, including tables, figures, and references. The title pages should specify the manuscript title, names and institutional affiliations of all authors exactly as they are to be printed, name and addresses of the author to whom requests for reprints should be addressed, and a running head of no more than 48 letters and spaces. When blind review has been requested, all identifying information including acknowledgments should be confined to the title page. The second page should include the manuscript title and an abstract of 100 to 150 words. Supply black-and-white originals or camera-ready glossy reproductions of all illustrations.

Manuscript Review

Manuscripts will be evaluated on the basis of style as well as content. Except for minor copyediting changes, authors will be responsible for clarity, conciseness, and felicity of expression. Accepted manuscripts are copyedited and typeset into page proofs. Authors are asked to correct errors and answer editors' queries and to return the proofs promptly to the publisher. Reprints may only be ordered at the time page proofs are returned.

Permissions

Contributors are responsible for all statements made in their work and for obtaining permission from copyright owners if they use an illustration or lengthy quote (over 500 words) published elsewhere. Contributors should write to both publisher and author of such material, requesting nonexclusive world rights in all languages for use in the present article and in all future editions of it.
