Membership Information

Regular and Associate Members of the Division must hold comparable status in APA, as stated in APA's bylaws. Names of new members are submitted to APA monthly.

Joint SPW/SWAP Memberships: If you belong to both organizations and have paid more than a \$15 renewal fee, you can get a refund, due to a reciprocal agreement between the Society for the Psychology of Women (SPW) and the Section on Women and Psychology (SWAP) of the Canadian Psychological Association. To obtain a refund of overpaid dues, contact your SPW/SWAP liaison and let her know of your joint membership. She will arrange for the refund to be sent to you, or donated to your primary organization, as you specify.

Affiliated Professional Members are non-APA members interested in the psychology of women, including international members and members of allied professions and behavioral sciences. Affiliated professional members pay dues directly to SPW and participate in Division elections, except elections for APA Council Representatives. Affiliated professional members elect a representative who is a voting member of the SPW Executive Committee.

Student Members are enrolled in graduate or undergraduate programs in psychology or related areas. Students elect a representative to the Executive Committee.

How To Join: To join the Society for the Psychology of Women (SPW), complete the form on the back of this page and send it to the SPW Administrative Office with a payment for dues for the current year. Alternatively, you may join SPW on-line at: <http://memforms.apa.org/apa/cli/divapp/>

Membership is for the calendar year. If you join before August 1, you will receive back issues of the *Psychology of Women Quarterly*. If you join after August 1, your membership will begin in January, unless you request otherwise.

After the application year, Regular and Associate members will be billed for the regular Division dues (\$27) on the annual APA dues statement. Affiliated professional members will be billed \$25 and students \$15 directly by the Division. Limited means members must request renewal in that category on an annual basis.

Dues support task forces, publications, special projects, and reduced fees for students and people of limited means.
