Area of Service: Staff Psychologist and Training Director for Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS).

Rank and Salary: We seek to fill this position at the Student Services Professional Academic-Related/ Academic Year, Level 1 (SSPAR/AY I - Counselor 1), however rank and salary are dependent upon the appointee's qualifications and experience. Professional Qualifications:

- A doctoral degree in clinical or counseling psychology from an accredited college or university with professional licensure as a psychologist is required at the time of appointment. If licensure is in a state other than California, the applicant must be license-eligible in the state of California (and California licensure will be expected within 6 months of hire).
- University counseling center experience as well as demonstrated team leadership and organizational abilities.
- Experience providing clinical supervision of therapists in training with demonstrated interest and effectiveness in clinical supervision.
- Strong therapy skills a must, including experience with time-limited and crisis interventions.
- Demonstrated ability to work cooperatively as a member of a clinical team, excellent written and oral communication skills, and personal and professional flexibility.
- Knowledge of a breadth of theoretical orientations with demonstrated openness to differing theoretical approaches and ability to supervise a variety of trainees.

Additional Preferred Qualifications:

- Professional licensure as a psychologist within the state of California.
- Two or more years university counseling center experience.
- One or more years supervisory experience of doctoral level trainees.
- Experience in the organization and management of a clinical training program.
- Demonstrated skills in, and commitment to, group therapy.
- Experience and interest in multicultural issues and therapeutic specialization in working with survivors of sexual assault, abuse, and other forms of trauma.

Candidates whose qualifications also suit them to prepare individuals to function in a culturally and ethnically diverse society are especially encouraged to apply.

Professional Duties: The person serving in this position will perform the general duties of a staff psychologist at CAPS, including time-limited individual and couples therapy, group therapy, intake assessments, crisis intervention, outreach services, and consultation with students, staff, and faculty. In addition, the role of Training Director will include responsibilities for managing and providing program leadership for our postgraduate residency and master's level practicum programs, including recruitment, training, and supervisory duties. Because this is a tenure-track position, additional responsibilities include scholarship (broadly defined) and service to the University, the profession, and the community.

General Information: Humboldt State University is part of the 23-campus California State University system.
