

The Department of Psychology at Suffolk University in Boston is seeking to fill two tenure track positions at the rank of Assistant Professor beginning Fall, 2008. The requirements for the first position include a Ph.D. in neuropsychology or related field, a demonstrated track record of programmatic research in the clinical neurosciences, and the potential to establish an externally fundable program of research. The applicant should be prepared to play a significant role within the neuropsychology concentration of our APA accredited clinical psychology Ph.D. program. The applicant will be expected to mentor graduate-level research and to teach both undergraduate and graduate courses, particularly those in neuropsychology and statistics. The successful candidate for the second position will have a Ph.D. in clinical psychology, a demonstrated track record of programmatic research in clinical psychology (specialty area open), and the potential to establish an externally funded program of research. The applicant will be expected to mentor graduate-level research and to teach both undergraduate and graduate core courses in psychopathology, assessment, and/or intervention (child or adult). Preference will be given to candidates who are licensed clinical psychologists or are license eligible. Suffolk University is located on historic Beacon Hill, an area providing rich opportunities for cultural, educational, and recreational activities. Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until December 1, 2007.
