## **Neil Chethik** – What Men Really Think of Their Relationships: Challenging Conventional Wisdom

Are men really commitment-phobic? Do they refuse to talk about their relationships? Are they really obsessed with sex? Neil Chethik conducted a landmark study of 350 American husbands and shares his surprising answers to these and other questions about men and relationships. Neil also shares what men told him about why they do (or don't) seek psychotherapy, and what styles of therapy work best for them.

BIO: Neil Chethik is an author, researcher, and speaker specializing in men's lives and family issues. He is the author of two books: *VoiceMale: What Husbands Really Think About Their Marriages, Their Wives, Sex, Housework and Commitment* (Simon & Schuster 2006), and *FatherLoss: How Sons of All Ages Come To Terms With the Deaths of Their Dads* (Hyperion 2001). His writings have appeared in hundreds of print and web publications. He is currently Writer-in-Residence at the Carnegie Center for Literacy and Learning in Lexington, Ky., where he lives with his wife, Kelly Flood, and son, Evan.
