
Washington's history is rich with the presence and influence of people of color. The settlement of Piscataway Indians in the early 17th century made them some of the area's earliest residents. The mid 1800s saw arrival of Chinese immigrants that settled just a few blocks from the White House and eventually relocated to build what is now Chinatown. The Black Broadway movement at the turn of the century changed the face of not only Washington's U Street, but American music and culture. In the 1950s and '60s, an influx of Latin American immigrants transformed the Adams Morgan neighborhood into a vibrant mecca of culture. And, that's just a small piece of the story.

Today, the landscape and the culture of this great city bear record of the legacy of past and present contributions of its ethnic minority residents. In every corner of the city and the surrounding areas you can find theaters, museums, restaurants, and monuments celebrating their contributions.
