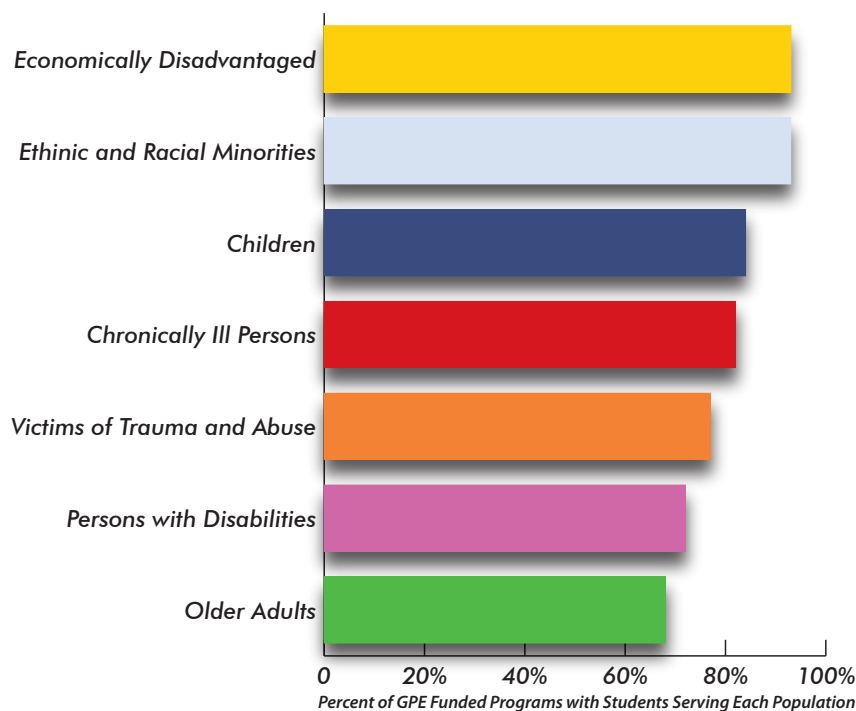




Graduate Psychology Education (GPE) Program: Federal Funding Yields Results

- Since 2002, GPE grants have provided interdisciplinary training for approximately 2,500 graduate students of psychology and other health professions for the provision of integrated health care services to underserved populations.
- Students benefitting from GPE grants have worked with other health professionals from over 30 different professions, including physicians (e.g., pediatricians, neurologists, oncologists, endocrinologists, surgeons and psychiatrists), nurses, dentists, pharmacists, occupational therapists, and social workers.
- GPE funding has allowed programs to double the number of students they are able to train; More students trained means more impact on underserved populations.
- All of the approximately 900 psychology graduate students who benefitted from GPE funds are expected to work with underserved populations and 34-100% will be working in underserved areas immediately after completing the training.
