

Memorandum of Understanding

between

The British Psychological Society

and the

American Psychological Association

The British Psychological Society (the Society) and the American Psychological Association (APA) agree as follows:

- whereas, the Charter of the Society and the Bylaws of the APA share mutual objectives calling for the advancement of the discipline in the public interest; and
- whereas, it is desirable to have integration and exchange between the psychological organisations in the United Kingdom and the United States; and
- whereas, mutual interests make it likely that occasions for joint consultation and co-operation will present themselves in the years to come; and
- whereas, both organisations wish to anticipate such occasions by establishing a framework, when possible, for their timely discussion.


Now, therefore, the Society and the APA affirm and reaffirm their working relations in this Memorandum of Understanding.

Furthermore, pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding, the executives of the Society and the APA shall maintain regular communication to discuss matters of common interest.


