American Psychological Association
and the
Psychological Society of Ireland*



The American Psychological Association (APA) and the Psychological Society of Ireland (PSI) agree as follows:

Whereas, the Bylaws of APA and the Memorandum and Articles of Association of PSI share mutual objectives calling for the advancement of the discipline in the public interest; and

Whereas, it is desirable to have integration and exchange between the psychological organizations in the United States and Ireland; and

Whereas, mutual concerns make it likely that occasions for joint consultation and cooperation will present themselves in the years to come; and

Whereas, both organizations wish to anticipate such occasions by establishing a framework, when possible, for their timely discussion;

Now therefore, APA and PSI affirm and reaffirm their working relations in this Memorandum of Understanding.

Furthermore, pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding, the executives of APA and PSI shall maintain regular communication to discuss matters of common concern.

Finally, APA and PSI will seek to identify projects and activities in which they may work together, assist or support one another, or otherwise cooperate for the betterment of psychology and the public interest.
